Buying a new electrical item from us? We'll recycle the one you're replacing for free. Simply bring the old electrical item into one of our stores within 28 days, show us the receipt for its replacement and we'll do the rest.

We can also collect items from customers' homes when making a delivery but there is a small charge for this to cover transport costs for large appliances.

What can I recycle?

Anything with a plug, cable or battery can be reused or recycled! The materials from recycled electricals can be used in everything from children's playgrounds to lifesaving equipment, while donated tech can help bridge the digital divide.

You'll find this symbol on all your electrical items. It is a reminder to recycle your old electricals, rather than binning them. [Crossed out wheelie bin symbol]

Reducing waste electricals

As part of our commitment to reducing the amount of unwanted electrical waste being incinerated or sent to landfill sites, we'll recycle your old electricals free of charge when you buy new ones. Together we can stop precious resources from being lost forever, save lives and help protect the planet.

Every year we collect, reuse and recycle thousands of tonnes of old electrical and electronic equipment.

We take all your old electricals to a recycling plant for processing and separation into individual materials, so that they can be turned into new, more useful things.

Optional FAQs for website:

Q: When did this happen?

A: The Retailer Take-back scheme kicked in on 1 January 2021 across the UK.

Q: Who is taking part?

A: Retailers selling over £100k of electricals per year will take your old item if you buy a similar new item from them.

Q: What can I recycle in store?

A: Everything with a plug, battery or cable can be recycled - even the plugs, batteries and cables themselves. If you've bought a new electrical or electronic product from us, we'll recycle your old one for you for free. For everything else, find your local reuse or recycling point on the [Recycle Your Electricals website](#).

Q: Will you only take back goods if I bought from you in the first place?

A: No. You could have bought your old product from any retailer.

Q: Does my new item have to be the same brand as the old one?

A: No. You can take back a broadly similar type of product, of any brand. So if you buy a DVD player, we will accept your old VHS player for recycling.

Q: Will you take back lightbulbs, batteries and vapes?

A: Yes. As we sell these types of items, we will recycle your old ones. We do not take back incandescent filament bulbs (apart from LED filament bulbs).

[If applicable:] We take back any very small electricals, regardless of whether a customer buys a new electrical item from us. This includes items which are less than 25cm on their longest side, like vapes and light bulbs.
