Pilot type	Kerbside collection
Pilot aim	To increase the amount of small electrical items in kerbside recycling collections, by raising awareness and encouraging correct disposal.
Outcome	 Small electricals collections tripled, with skips filling twice as fast as anticipated A trial of residual waste collections every three weeks led to residual waste volumes halving and a district-wide roll-out from September 2022



Collection approach

Mid Devon began a fortnightly kerbside collection for recycling small electricals alongside existing recycling in September 2020.

A successful trial of 3-weekly residual waste collections led to a district-wide roll-out in September 2022, encouraging more recycling and halving residual waste.

Small electricals collections increased threefold, with skips filling faster than expected.

Despite staffing and resource challenges, the pilot saw positive resident response and ongoing improvements in recycling behaviour.

Future plans

Residents can still recycle their small electricals at kerbside in 2025.
